Summary of key findings for parents

This provision is outstanding

- The quality of teaching is exemplary. Staff have an excellent understanding of how children learn and develop. Therefore, they provide exciting learning opportunities to challenge and extend children's learning. Consequently, all children make remarkable progress.
- Staff make very effective use of the required progress checks for children aged two years to identify concerns in their development. Furthermore, they work in strong partnership with parents and outside agencies in supporting children with additional needs. This helps to reduce gaps in children's learning.
- Children form strong emotional bonds with the staff. Many children have formed special friendships with their peers. This effectively promotes their emotional well-being.
- Staff welcome parents and children from all communities. Children learn about other cultures and traditions through celebrations and through art and craft activities. Therefore, they are developing their understanding of the world and learn to value differences.
- The Head and staff have a strong understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. They reflect this knowledge in continually evaluating performance and driving improvement, to provide high standards in children's care and learning.
- Staff have established excellent links with local schools and effectively share information with school staff when children move to school. This ensures continuity in children's education.
- Staff recruitment and vetting procedures are highly robust. This ensures that all staff are suitable to work with children.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

enhance resources further to extend children's understanding of technology.

Inspection findings

How well the early years provision meets the needs of the range of children who attend. This is outstanding

Staff have an excellent understanding of the unique needs of each child. Consequently, they plan extremely well for individual children's learning and all children make rapid progress given their starting points. Children arrive happily and are very eager to watch the 'living eggs'. They curiously ask the staff if the eggs have hatched. They enjoy an exciting group time, as staff provide them the opportunity to hold the chicks in their hands. Children comment that the chicks cuddle under the light to keep themselves warm. This develops children's understanding of the world, and they learn about living things and how they grow. Children wheel a mobile shop around the classroom and pretend to sell fruits. This develops their imagination and supports their communication and language development. They use wooden play money to give change to their customers. This promotes their mathematical development and prepares them for next stages in their learning. However, staff miss some opportunities to extend children's learning further, for example, by providing them resources to explore the use of technology.

The contribution of the early years provision to the well-being of children is outstanding

Staff are excellent role models. Children follow their example and learn to care for each other and their environment. This promotes their personal, social and emotional development. Staff support children's independence extremely well. For example, children help to cut fruits in preparation for snack time. They independently serve themselves snack and water and tidy up when they finish snack. Furthermore, children learn to make healthy choices, as staff work in close partnership with parents to ensure children have nutritious meals. This effectively promotes children's health and well-being.

The effectiveness of the leadership and management of the early years provision is outstanding

Leadership and management is exemplary. The manager is highly reflective of the quality of care provided to children and continually strives to raise the quality of the provision. Staff and parents are fully involved in evaluating the setting and identifying areas that need improvement. Consequently, plans for improvement are highly effective and successful. Supervision arrangements are excellent. As a result, staff performance is of a very high standard and is continually improving through training and mutual support. The manager has established strong links with the local authority, especially in matters relating to safeguarding children. Consequently, she has developed robust safeguarding policies and procedures. Staff have a very thorough understanding of procedures to follow to protect children's well-being. Therefore, children thrive in a safe and happy environment.
